

## END NOTES: CHAPTER X

10. Ordinance 1720 repealed Sections 105, 106, and 107 insofar as they pertained to Pool and Billiard Rooms, Bowling Alleys, Shooting Galleries, and Theaters requiring licenses.
20. Pursuant to the amendments of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, approved in 1968, the Mayor no longer exercises judicial authority and ordinance violation cases are heard by the District Magistrate.
30. Ordinance 1019, January 14, 1982, repealed, in its entirety, Ordinance 243, October 8, 1940, and Ordinance 338, January 11, 1949, which required licenses for amusement machines. Amusement machines are now taxed (see Tax Section of this Codification).
31. The background of Ordinance 1810 is as follows: The Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts is a major public celebration, enhancing the cultural heritage of the Borough, conferring significant economic benefit to the business community of the Borough. As a result of the number of visitors, townspeople and participants visiting and utilizing the downtown area of the Borough of State College during the Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts, significant demands are made on the Borough's resources to provide adequate protection for the health, welfare and safety of Festival goers as well as other persons residing in or visiting the community during the same time period. As a result, it has been necessary for the Borough to enact special legislation and regulations to assist in the maintenance of public order as well as to safeguard the health, welfare and safety of the residents, visitors and vendors during the period of the Central Pennsylvania of the Arts. To facilitate the enforcement of these necessary ordinances, Council hereby designates those public streets and public areas as the Arts Festival Area and, furthermore, establishes a period of time during which the Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts may be conducted. Wherever the term "Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts" and/or "Arts Festival" is utilized in Borough ordinances, such term(s) shall mean the area and time period designated herein.
32. Section 2 of Ordinance 1810 stipulated that the legislation would take effect immediately.
37. The background of Ordinance 1819 is that the Central Pennsylvania Festival of the Arts, in 1994, began a public celebration which confers significant economic benefit to the business community and which offers the public an alternative to celebrating the coming of the new year with alcohol. As a result of the number of visitors, townspeople and participants visiting and utilizing the downtown area during the First Night festival, demands are made on the Borough's resources to provide adequate protection for the health, safety and welfare of participants as well as other persons residing in or visiting the community during the same time period. As a result, it has been necessary for the Borough to enact special legislation and regulations to assist in the maintenance of public

order as well as to safeguard the health, welfare and safety of residents, visitors and vendors during the period in which First Night is conducted.

To facilitate the enforcement of these necessary ordinances, Council designated an area and time for First Night. Wherever the term First Night is used in ordinances, the term shall mean the area and time period designated herein. Section 2 of Ordinance 1819 stated the ordinance would take effect immediately.

45. Ordinance 1391 repealed Ordinance 173 in its entirety. Ordinance 173 required an annual inspection of utility poles and fees for all poles located within the Borough limits. This jurisdiction was lost when the State Public Utility Commission was authorized to oversee all utilities within the State.
50. Ordinance 1026, Section 509, repealed Ordinance 963, November 11, 1979, in its entirety, which ordinance previously repealed Ordinances 463, 604, 770 and 786.
